

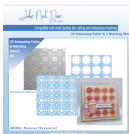
JND486 – Moroccan Tile Layer Set - by John Lockwood



Instructions by June Smith

Information:

John has created a 'You Tube Video' dated May 2024, using the new JND486 Moroccan Tile Layer Set which have been designed by John. These are a new release; in the pack you have a beautiful 3D Moroccan Embossing Folder with 2 different stencils. These are not like your usual EF's in as much as these are clear folders not cloudy like others are. You will see as the demo progresses how each of the stencils in the set click onto the embossed card rather than you having to move it around to try and get the stencil in the correct position. John has made a beautiful card using these products. I would advise that you visit it as well as following these instructions.



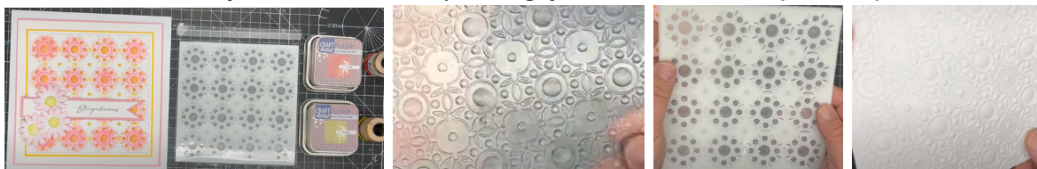
Materials

7" x 7" White Top Folding Card Blank
JND486 Moroccan Tile Layer Set (2)
JND Stitched Daisy Die
Essential Coconut White Card
Essential Spring Yellow Card
Essential Pink Card
CA Pearl Fusion – Coral & Sunlight
A4 Die Cutting Machine
Glue Glaze
2mm Foam Tape
Craft Kit

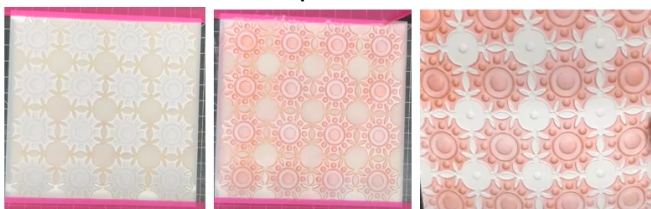
Method:

- Cut a piece of plain white stamping card to 6" x 6" or ideally 5³/₄" x 5³/₄" which means that you can get 2 pieces out of an A4 sheet. Position this inside your Moroccan EF and run through your die cutting machine. You then get a beautiful raised design on your card.

- Next we need to secure the stencil onto the embossed card, one stencil is the background, and the other is the detailed one. It is far easier to use the lines on a cutting board or your desk top to line it all up as John is doing. Add the larger stencil onto the embossed card so that it almost clicks into place, Tape it down across the top and bottom to stop it moving, (you could do the sides as well if you wanted too) using your Craft Artist pink tape.



- You may find that it is easier to use blending brushes to add the inks onto your stencil because any stencil could rip the foam on the end of your blending tool, also because there is a lot of fine detail on the embossed stencil. Pick up some of the Coral Fusion Ink and add this all over the stencil.



- Below is a photo to compare using the stencil flat and also embossed, it looks stunning. On the embossed piece you can even see where the white area is which hasn't been inked.
- Then add the other stencil over the design, you will find that it just clicks in, and secure it with CA Pink tape along the top and bottom, this time we will use a blending dauber or brush to go over the stencil with the Sunlight ink.



- Bring in your 8" top folding card blank, with a mat and layer of Pink and Yellow card added onto it, add wet glue to the back of the main yellow design and add this onto the card blank.



- You can then decorate your card using Stitched Daisy flowers and a stamped flag banner across the front.

Your creation is now complete. I hope you have enjoyed these instructions.
