# Using all 3 Frame Makers – JND487/488 & 489 6" x 6", 5.75 x 5.75 & 5" x 5" - by John Lockwood



Instructions compiled by June Smith.

John has created a 'You Tube' video using all the above mentioned dies, dated 27 August 2024, I have incorporated these in this set of Instructions. I would advise that you visit them as well as following these instructions through to the end before commencing the project.

#### Information:

I have listed below all 3 of the frame it sets in number order, we will only be using the frame it dies from each one, however this will give you an idea of all the beautiful dies in each set.


### JND487 – 6" x 6" Frame It – Deco Frame Maker (10)



1 – 6" Frame Maker Die

- 2-5 Decorative panels with circles in them
- 6 Square die with decorative floral corner panels
- 7 Stitched Circle Die
- 8 Decorative Circle Die with a square cut out of the middle
- 9 Stitched Square Die which fits inside die 8
- 10 Square Decorative (like Ironwork) Panel

### JND488 – 5.75 x 5.75 Frame It – Celtic Frame Maker (8)



 $1: -5\frac{3}{4}$ " x  $5\frac{3}{4}$ " Main Frame It die.

2: -5: - These are the 4 Celtic patterned cutting dies which are slightly smaller and will fit inside the Main Frame, these highlight the mitred corners

- 6: This is a smaller Celtic frame without any outside or inside cutting edges.
- 7: Square die which fits inside the small Celtic Frame no 6.
- 8 : Square Celtic Panel, (this matches the Infinity die set)

## JND489 - 5" x 5" Frame It - Georgian Frame Maker (16)



1: -5" x 5" Main Frame It die, with a 3½" square in the middle of the frame, this gives a 3/4" frame all the way around.

2:-5: - These are the 4 debossed cutting dies which are slightly smaller and will fit inside the Main Frame, these highlight the mitred corners

6: -9: - These are the 4 Georgian debossed pattern dies (they don't cut in or out ) that fit inside dies 2-5.

- 10: Square die which fits inside the Main Frame It Die
- 11: Square double stitched cutting die with double stitched corners on it
- 12: Inside Plain Circle
- 13: Decorative Filigree Circle Frame
- 14: 16: are decreasing in size double stitched circle dies.

We are going to make a card similar to this 1<sup>st</sup> version using just the 'frame it' die from each set. Here are 2 other examples of using 2 frames and 1 frame to make these cards.




#### Materials:

Hand-made exact 6" x 6" size Top Folding White Card Blank CA Essential Coconut White Card CA Black Card JND487 6" x 6" Frame It – Deco Frame Maker (10) JND488 5<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 5<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" Frame It – Celtic Frame Maker (8) JND489 5" x 5" Frame It – Georgian Frame Maker (16) JND389 Stitched Flower die (Daisy) JND387 Shadow Leaves (6) JND483 6" Argyle Layer 3D Embossing Folder Versafine Smokey Grey Ink Pad and finger dauber CA Clear Dew Drops 2mm Foam Tape Die Cutting Machine Craft Kit

### Method:

- We will be using the outer dies from all 3 sets. Starting with die no 1 from the JND 488 Celtic Frame, cut this out of Coconut White Card, it has the mitred frame with the indented mitre in the four corners, the depth of which depends on the pressure of your machine, then add 2mm foam tape onto the back.
- Next cut out die no 1 from the JND487 'Deco Frame It' set from Black card and add 2mm foam tape onto the back.
- If we then cut die no 1 from the JND 489 Georgian Frame set and placed this on top of the frame you can see that this would work but if we stacked it underneath/behind the frame you will see the white edge on the inside of the frame without any white showing on the outside.
- Then remove the yellow tape from the back of the large white frame and adhere onto the black frame, this will give you a perfect 1/8<sup>th</sup> of an inch border all the way around. Then remove the tape from the black frame and it is best to do this with the white smaller frame on your table top and place the frame over it as you can see exactly how to position the frame.



• To make up our card, we then cut another piece of the Coconut White card and run this through the Argyle Embossing Folder to give this beautiful pattern on it. Bring back in your frame and add foam tape onto the back making sure that the foam tape is in the centre of the frame not too near either edge. Then again go top down onto your embossed card, making sure the pattern is even all the way around and add the frame onto it.

• Add wet glue onto the back of your exact 6" x 6" Top folding white card blank and add the frame onto the top, this fits exactly and all you are seeing is this picture frame. We are not using a commercial 6" card blank because these are 5<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 5<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>". There are instructions already in the group of how to make your own card blanks and envelopes.



We are then going to decorate the card with some flowers and leaves, Cut out the Stitch Flowers from White card and the Shadow Leaves from Black card. Layer the flowers up offsetting each petal and add a little bit of Versafine Smokey Grey Ink into the centre and outside edges of each petal. We are only using the 2 largest leaves for this card, the rest of them we will put in our stash box for another card. Add wet glue to the back of each of the leaves and add onto the front left-hand side of the frame on your card, see photo below.



• Then again adding wet glue onto the back add the 3 flowers in a cluster onto the middle of the leaves. If you wanted you could stamp or die cut a sentiment to place onto the card, but for this one we will leave as it is. You then have a very quick and easy card to give or send to a lucky recipient.
